Reception RBA

At the start of Reception, S.E.I.S staff continue to learn more about your child. Part of this process involves them participating in a national Reception Baseline Assessment. It sounds very official but simply involves your child spending 1-1 time with their class teacher participating in some fun activities.

The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school, using materials that most children of your child's age will be familiar with. The purpose of the assessment is to provide the starting point for a progress measure that will help parents understand how well schools support their pupils to progress between reception and year 6.

Maths



Your child will be engaging in lots of fun practical activities that you will also be able to work on at home. Some of these may be very helpful additions to sharing out the family chores, especially when we focus on sorting socks, shoes and putting things back where they belong! Stories and rhymes will also be focused on and linked to our weekly maths themes.

This term, we will be exploring ways to match and sort items by different criteria such as colour, size and type. We will also be encouraged to think of our own ways to sort things as well as trying to guess what criteria the grown-ups used.

We will look at different ways to compare size, mass and capacity. There will be many new things to learn as we have fun working out ways to compare amounts using terms such as more and fewer to describe what we are doing.

During the last few weeks, we will be looking for different patterns all around us as well as making lots of patterns of our own.

PE

We will start PE on Thursday 26th. We have PE sessions on **Thursdays** and your children can come to school in their PE kits for the day. You can check what is needed for PE on our website.

Please name everything and remember to take out earrings on PE days.





Your children are already working hard to become even more independent. Can you further support this by encouraging them to...

- ☺ Wash their hands properly with soap and water.
- ☺ Manage their own personal hygiene.
- ☺ Be able to take on and off their jumpers and cardigans.
- ☺ Hang up their coats and put away their own belongings.
- ☺ Use a knife and fork to eat.

Some days, you may see a different 'Grown Up' in your child's class. No need to worry, as when this happens your child will be in the capable hands of Mrs Prudden, Mrs Bland or Mrs Bennett and their usual adult will soon be back with them again.



Tip of the Week! Thank you for your continued co-operation at drop off and pick-ups. For safety reasons, please can you stand back from the gates at the end of the day. We can also find you quicker if you stand in the **same place** every day and give us a wave when your child is at the front of the line.

Outside Learning

We have access to our Outside Areas in all reasonable weathers. We often go outside as part of our learning, so being prepared **for all weathers is necessary**. Please can you ensure that your child **always** has appropriate clothing in school e.g. coat, hats, scarfs and gloves (when needed), sensible footwear, a vest under their T-shirt if it is very cold etc. We do have wellies and all-in-ones for those very wet, yet fun, occasions. We are often helping your child to become increasingly independent by helping them to zip up their coats, put on winter garments and keep all belongings together. This independence can really help us all to get outside and enjoy our learning much quicker. Please can you make sure that anything that can be taken off by your child is clearly named, as our lost property boxes are still bulging from last year.
