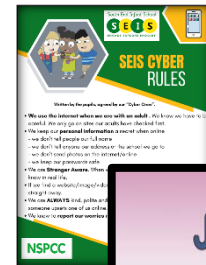
South End Infant School



Online Safety is an integral part of our learning journey at South End Infant School. We deliver a Computing Curriculum, which enables and equips our pupils for the Online World. We encourage problem solving and communication. We believe, as NSPCC do, that “The most effective online filter is an educated child”. Our pupils help to write our School Cyber Rules and they know them well; they know how to stay safe online and they know how to report their worries, they support each other and know being kind online is essential.

During our first whole school Online Safety assembly, we focussed on the importance of our School Cyber Rules and what to do if we see something we do not like. We tell a grown-up we trust if we are worried. We watched Jessie and Friends Episode 1.

The children have discussed what being safe online means.

They have discussed age-appropriate sites, only going online when an adult is close by, only talking online to people we know in real life, accessing games with an appropriate PEGI/Gaming Age Rating and keeping personal information safe.
