Safer Internet Day.

This term we are thinking about how we can be careful and stay safe online. During our Safer Internet Day, on February 10th, we will talk about:

- Artificial intelligence or AI - from voice assistants, to chatbots.
- How AI can be used safely and responsibly and ensure everyone feels empowered to adapt alongside changing technology.

These activities support our ongoing conversations during computing and online safety lessons. In class, we talk about choosing safe things to watch and being careful with the links and pop-ups that we click on. We talk about gaming and online chat/messaging.

The children know how to choose safe games and they know not to talk to people they do not know (online and in real life). Pupils know what to do if they see something which upsets or worries them, they know to talk to a trusted grown up. We have discussed the PEGI rating (age rating) on apps, downloads and/or game boxes; we have explored the latest safe games for infant school ages and how to be SMART online.
