Please talk to your children about the rules of staying safe online and stranger awareness, we talk about this in our online safety assemblies and in our Purple Mash 2BeSafe lessons. We also refer to our SEIS Cyber Rules written by our Cyber Crew members throughout the year.

In our last assembly we talked about stranger awareness and being **SMART**. We know someone we don't know in real life is a stranger and we don't talk to strangers in the real world **or** the online world. If we are worried about something online, we tell a grown-up we trust. People online are not always who they say they are; we don't chat to them and we **never** share personal information with them!
