What is Relationship and Sex Education?

From September 2020 Relationships Education has become a statutory subject for Primary Schools in England.

South End Infant School and South End Junior School are both following the Jigsaw Programme to deliver their RSE Curriculum ensuring that all children receive a cohesive and age appropriate education in a format that will be familiar throughout their Primary Education.

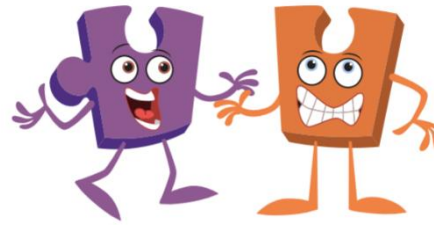
What are the aims of RSE?

There are four main aims for teaching RSE within the context of Primary School PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education):

- To enable young people to understand and respect their bodies, and be able to cope with the changes puberty brings, without fear or confusion
- To help young people develop positive and healthy relationships appropriate to their age, development etc. (respect for self and others)
- To support young people to have positive self-esteem and body image, and to understand the influences and pressures around them
- To empower them to be safe and safeguarded

This leaflet is designed to give Parents / Carers information about which aspects of the Jigsaw RSE will be taught within our Infant School setting.

What is Jigsaw, the mindful approach to PSHE?



Jigsaw PSHE aims to support schools to work in partnership with parents and carers to ensure appropriate, relationship and sex education in the context of the PSHE.

The Jigsaw PSHE relationship and sex education units of work aim to give children their entitlement to information about relationships, puberty and human reproduction, **appropriate to their ages and stages of development.** This work is treated in a matter-of-fact and sensitive manner to allay embarrassment and fear and helps children to cope with change, including puberty and to learn about families, friendships and healthy relationships. Jigsaw aims to build the positive.

What will my child taught specifically in Sex Education?

The 'Changing Me' unit is taught over 6 weeks in the final summer term each year. Each Year Group is taught appropriate content to their age and developmental stage. Any questions that a teacher feels are beyond the remit of the Year Group will be directed back to parents. In our Infant Setting the content of this part of Jigsaw is:

- Foundation** Growing up: how we have changed since we were babies
- Year 1** Boys' and girls' bodies; naming body parts
- Year 2** Boys' and girls' bodies; body parts and respecting privacy (which parts of the body are private and why this is)
